 The petition of Leo Alexander hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:
 First, My place of residence is 1145 Michigan Street, Detroit, Mich.
 Second, My occupation is Self-employed
 Third, I was born on the 15th day of August, anno Domini 1890, at Stachowice, Galicia, Austria
 Fourth, I emigrated to the United States from Stachowice, Galicia, Austria on or about the 2nd day of July, anno Domini 1914, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York City, N. Y. in the SS. S. S. S. S. of Stachowice, Galicia, Austria on the 17th day of July, anno Domini 1914, in the vessel SS. S. S. S. S.
 Fifth, I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States in the U. S. District Court of Eastern District of Michigan at Detroit, Mich. in the U. S. District Court of Eastern District of Michigan on the 15th day of July, anno Domini 1914
 Sixth, I am single married. My wife's name is Anna and she was born on the 15th day of July, anno Domini 1914
 I have no children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

1. I hereby apply under section 241(b) of the Nationality Act of 1940, to the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization for a new Certificate of Naturalization in lieu of one which was issued to me. There are enclosed with this application, as required by law and regulations, three photographs of myself, each of which I have signed, and a money order, No. 55796 in the sum of \$1, made out payable to the order of the "Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Washington, D. C.," in payment for the new naturalization paper.

2. My full true name is Leo Alexander
3. I was born at Hockenheim, Germany on Feb. 13, 1896
4. I arrived in the United States at New York on Aug. 30, 1912
5. I now reside at 3203 Collingwood, Detroit, Wayne, Michigan
6. My personal description is: Age 45 years, sex male, color white, complexion red (fair), color of eyes Brown, color of hair gray-black, height 5 feet 10 1/2 inches, weight 200 pounds, visible distinctive marks none vis.

Marital status married former nationality German
7. My ~~(certificate of naturalization)~~ numbered 128280 was issued to me by U.S. District Court at Detroit, Wayne, Michigan on May 28, 1920

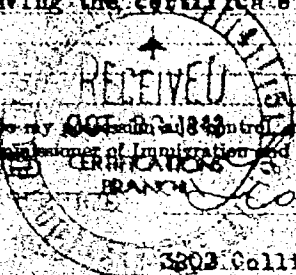
8. Since May 28, 1920 the date upon which I became a citizen of the United States of America, I have not lost my nationality by (a) marriage to an alien; (b) obtaining naturalization in a foreign state; (c) taking an oath or making an affirmation or other formal declaration of allegiance to a foreign state; (d) entering, or serving in, the armed forces of a foreign state and thereby acquiring the nationality of such foreign state; (e) accepting, or performing the duties of, any office, post, or employment under the government of a foreign state or political subdivision thereof for which only nationals of such state are eligible; (f) voting in a political election in a foreign state or participating in an election or plebiscite to determine the sovereignty over foreign territory; (g) making a formal renunciation of nationality before a diplomatic or consular officer of the United States in a foreign state; (h) being convicted by a court martial of deserting the military or naval service of the United States in time of war; (i) being convicted by a court martial or by a court of competent jurisdiction of committing an act of treason against, or attempting by force to overthrow or bearing arms against the United States; (j) residence abroad after my naturalization; or (k) in any other manner, nor has my naturalization, to my knowledge, been revoked by any court. I am now a citizen of the United States of America.

9. I have been absent from the United States since the above-named date upon which I became a citizen of the United States of America: U.S. P.P. 607 567666 For visit--Germany and France; 1921--June until September from New York--S.S. Olympic returning Berengaria via N.Y. U.S. P.P. 1928--Quebec Ont. Canada S.S. Express of Scotland returning Express of France--via Quebec.

10. Such paper became ~~lost~~ on or about May 1939 at Detroit, Michigan under the following circumstances: I have been unable to locate the certificate since May of 1939. I last recall having the certificate at my home and it has evidently become lost or misplaced.

11. In case such paper should be recovered and come into my possession or control, I ascertain its whereabouts; I will report the facts and will surrender such paper to the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization immediately.
